# 1-2-1 Mentoring Replaces Big Brothers Big Sisters Program

Same Great Program, New Name

Cray is still offering a great mentoring program that matches children in Lawrence County with caring mentors, but just under a new name: 1-2-1 Mentoring. After being connected for 24 years as an affiliate of Big Brothers Big Sisters of America, new staffing and revenue requirements by the national office would have increased our local chapter's operating costs by more than 50%. Since the local program operates solely through the generosity of donors, grants, and the United Way, a simple switch in name will allow our mentoring program to continue.

Many of the same programmatic elements, policies, and procedures will continue uninterrupted. Our community partners, mentors, and families have all stuck with us through the transition. Cray is proud of the partnership with BBBS, that allowed the program to grow and match over 700 children to date. We are also excited to have discovered a way to keep this opportunity in Lawrence County and continue to make life better for kids through the power of meaningful relationships.

# **Visitation House Moves**

With Cray's main office moving downtown, the Visitation and Reintegration Programs have moved into the Highland Ave. location, allowing for program expansion.

The House serves as a place for children who are placed outside of the home, to meet with their parents regularly. The program teaches parenting skills, strengthening the bond between parents and kids, and maintaining safety. The ultimate goal is to help these families transition back home together.

The previous location had only 4 visit rooms and with the move, there are now 8 spaces available. The program is currently serving 29 families (a total of over 100 weekly visit hours).



Many of these children are also involved with Cray's Foster Care Program and Crossroads After School Program. Cray partners with the Children's Advocacy Center, the Bair Foundation, Lawrence County Children and Youth Services, Children's Aid Society, and local Attorneys to help families in our community.
