

## Visitation Home

Over the past year, the Visitation Home has experienced significant growth. We have hired two new full-time workers, bringing our total staff to eight. We continue to operate at near capacity with referrals from Lawrence County Children and Youth Services (CYS). Currently, we are looking to update some of the visit rooms to include a "teen room," which would include games and activities more challenging and entertaining for the older youths and their parents. The staff at the Visitation Home are beginning to implement case specific and family driven Objectives and Tasks, replacing the generalized goals that had been identified by CYS when the case was referred. The Objectives and Tasks provide the families with monthly measurable documentation of progress made, or lack of progress made.

The Visitation Home has begun to have In-Home staff trainings, addressing issues related to the supervision of visits and family reintegration. We continue to look forward to more progress in the months to come as we strive to make every experience more pleasurable for our families.

After two years off due to COVID, we were able to resume one of our after school site-based programs last year at Cray's Crossroads program and had a great response from students. The program runs from late September to mid-may, meeting three Wednesday evenings a month from 5:00 - 6:30 PM. High School mentors are matched with an elementary school aged friend to help with school work, participate in activities, and have a lot of fun together. Volunteering in this program is a fun way for students to get community services hours. #### Now is the Time!

Research shows that people who are thinking about becoming a mentor need to hear about it *seven times* before they commit to doing it. Unfortunately, we are in a situation now where we have more children who are waiting for a mentor than children who are actually matched with a mentor. We are hoping to change that over the next couple of months. If you know someone who would be a great mentor, please let them know about us! Our community based mentors range in age from 20-75. The children we have waiting for a mentor range in age from 9-16. Our volunteers are from all over the county, and so are the children we serve, although most are in New Castle and Ellwood City.
